# HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

The principal objective of the state Government is to ensure maximum access to educational facilities to all the children in the state above the age of five years. Provision of quality education has always been a major concern of the government. Education system in the state has witnessed an enormous expansion during the last 25 years to complement the new developing trends in the education sector. The decentralized process of planning and the adoption of the involvement of the Panchayati Raj bodies in the management framework has added new dimension to the process of reforms in the existing system of education management.

Facilitation of involvement of School management committees and Panchayati Raj institutes in the State has given a big boost to the present day stress on sustainable development with participatory approach, a huge task which could not be possible unless holistic development of human resources are taken care of. Keeping this in view the State Government has prioritized the education sector for improvement at all levels of education.

Accordingly interventions leading to targets and goals are set as under:

- Teaching and Teacher Management.
- · School based Management.
- Education and Technology.
- Decentralization of School Education and Community Participation.
- Financing of School Education.
- Supervision and support system for school improvement.
- School mapping for devolving required facilities.
- Facilitating education system with computers.

Wide diversity of Socio-Economic structures, languages, cultures, traditions and values persistent in the State, the role of different community in shaping basic education for all in the State, though a challenging task, can be accessed taking into consideration the available experience and resources in the field. State guided by its Socio-Economic setting has adopted a different strategy towards achieving these goals.

The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Scheme has brought back most of the out of school children in the school system. Incentives like Mid Day Meal, uniforms, free text books, raincoat, shoes and socks have helped to retain the students in school system.

The scheme like RMSA being introduced in the Secondary level will of-course help those underprivileged and needy students to complete their secondary education successfully.

The scheme of Shakshar Bharat Mission was launched in the State during the financial year 2010-11 to achieve 100% literacy by 2015.

Taking all the above approaches in tandum with our policy various steps have been taken by the government in the year 2009 specially to facilitate the teaching learning process. The Human Resource Development Department on its part has taken up the policies of the government and subsequently implemented in the year 2009-10.

As such the report has been prepared by various sections of the department.

# I. STUDENT DATA:-

Class wise Individual data from all the Govt. and Private Schools have been collected and 1. computerized. Each student has been allotted a unique code number for Identification, Report on Student Enrolment in Sikkim for 2009 has been completed.

Further the Calculation of the following indices has been completed.

- a) Class wise Enrolment for 2010 Session.
- b) Stage wise Dropout rates for the District and State for 2008 &2009.
- c) Class wise failure for District and State 2008 &2009.
- d) Class wise Repeater rate for District and the State for 2008 &2009

### MAN POWER DATA:-. 2.

Information on collection on individual Man Power from each Govt. Schools has been completed and computerized for 2008 and information on collection of Individual Manpower from each Govt. School has been completed for 2010 and is under process of validation of above Report.

As per Government of India Guidelines, for conducting of the 8th All India School Education Survey by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, New Delhi with NCERT as the 3. Nodal Agency, the State Survey Unit and District Survey unit had been formed vide Notification No.02/640/PME/HRDD/115,dated 03/07/2009 and No.02/640/PME/HRDD/117 dated 30.01.2010, respectively .The objective of the above survey is to develop the database to calculate and analyze a set of Educational Indicators. The 8th All India School Education Survey was launched in four District w.e.f 13th Sept 2010 and completed on 15th Dec 2010. The data Entry works is on progress at District by Data Entry operator of SSA Unit

This is 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme towards total cost of the Survey, would be born by M.H.R.D.

The Project "Sikkim -e- Education Infosys" shall be developed for H.R.D.Department, Government of Sikkim using latest State of Art Technology which will overcome the limitation in 4. the Existing System to bridge the data gap and provide solutions to meet the Total Information need of the Department. The system would be user friendly and authenticated web based solutions with data captured at the Block Administration Centre level thereby decentralizing the process of data collection, verification and data feeding .The BAC shall be equipped with computer system for data entry .A technically sound persons shall be appointed who shall be responsible for data collection, verification and data entry .The data will be directly fed into web based application from each BAC.

The entire software shall be broadly categorized into following Modules:-

- Employee Information System (EIS)
- Student Information System (SIS)

- Infrastructure Information System (IFS)
- Departmental Application (Application for different sections of the Department)

# II. ENGINEERING CELL

During financial year 2010-11 under the engineering cell, HRDD various schemes are taken up under various heads of account. Under NABARD, 63 nos. of construction of school building and one Degree College at Rhenock, Rungdung have been taken up under RIDF-XIII, XIV & XV. Most of the school buildings are completed and some are in verge of completion. All these works are programmed to complete by end of March, 2012.

Under NLCPR Head of account: 47 nos. of school building 97 nos. of rain water harvesting in various school and 5 nos. of multipurpose hall cum 12- room school buildings have been taken up. Construction of all the 47 nos. of school buildings and 97 nos. of rain water harvesting have been completed and handed over to school authority to run the classes. The construction of all 5 nos. of multipurpose hall cum classroom are targeted to complete by end of March 2012.

Under NEC funding - construction of 13 nos. of school building, supply of furniture to 261 nos. of rural schools (total 7008 nos.) and construction of science college at Soreng has been taken up and all these works are targeted to complete by end of March 2012.

Under ACA/SPA funding: a) Upgradation of Govt. Degree College at Tadong and b) Establishment of Govt. Degree College at Yangthang, Gyalshing West Sikkim have been taken up. The Upgradation work of Govt. Degree College, Tadong is targeted to complete by March 2012. However the Establishment of Govt. Degree College at Yangthang, Gyalshing West Sikkim is under process for issuing of Work Order. The department had also taken up construction of school buildings under BADP and TSP funding. Under BADP, 9 nos. of school have been taken up and will be completed within this financial year. Under TSP, the construction of Girls' and boys' hostels in Govt. Degree College at Tadong are to be taken up. Many schools and multipurpose hall in various schools in four districts taken up are in under in various degree of progress

Under MHRD(Technical Education) the construction of Polytechnic college at Mangshila is taken up and are under progress and is targeted to complete by end of March 2013. However the construction of Polytechnic College at Yangthang, Gaylshing West Sikkim is under tender process.

# III. SANSKRIT EDUCATION SECTION

- 1) The file has been processed to takeover the 12 Sanskrit Pathshala by the State Government.
- 2) The file of 29 teachers who has been working in the schools on co-terminus basis has been processed for regularization.
- 3) Four (4) nos. of adhoc teachers files who have been working in the Pathshala for last many years have been put up for regularization.
- 4) One graduate teacher, Shri. Yam Prasad Shankar of Lingee Secondary School was being deputed to attend four days orientation programme for key Resource Person in Sanskrit(in the light of NCF-2005,CCE & R.T.E) from 30.11.2010 to 3.12.2010 to NCERT, New Delhi.
- 5) Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya has been shifted from Gyalshing to Samdong (East Sikkim).
- 6) One New Lecturer in Navya Vyakaran Mr. Khemlal Dawari has been appointed at Rajya (Government) Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Samdong East Sikkim on regular basis.
- 7) Sanskrit textbooks have been provided from VIth, VIIth and VIII th class to all 29 schools.

# IV. LANGUAGE SECTION

- 1. All the Section i.e. Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo, Nepali and Rai completed the manuscript of Text Books for the academic session 2011 during the month of October 2010, and the same was handed over to the Joint Director, Text Book Section in the first week of November 2010.
- Syllabus and Model Questions were prepared for class IX, X, XI and XII in terms of Central Board of Secondary Education for the academic session 2011-12 in Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo and Nepali.
- 3. Question papers for class VIII annual examination 2010 were prepared in Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo and Nepali.
- 4. A bridge course primer in Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo and Nepali for drop outs (level I-V) has been published under the aegis of S.S.A. in 2011.
- 5. An orientation workshop on C.C.E. & R.T.E.was organized in which 200 language teachers participated. The programme was organized in collaboration with the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan in March 2011.
- 6. The Central Board of Secondary Education organized a two day workshop w.e.f. 25<sup>th</sup> May 2011 to 26<sup>th</sup> May 20conference hall for preparation of model question papers and answer key for class IX to XII for the a/s 2011-201Sixteen (16) Bhutia, fifteen (15) Lepcha and nine (9) Limboo language teachers were appointed on ad-hoc basis.

### V. SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

The Scholarship Section of Human Resource Development Department, Govt. Of Sikkim looks after the implementation of Scholarship schemes of both the State and centrally sponsored schemes of Govt. Of India.

The major ongoing activities looked after by the Scholarship Section, HRDD are as under:

- Allotment of Quota Seats to Students for pursuing various Post-Matric courses in and outside the State.
- Printing and issue of application forms for the State Common Entrance Test for admission of students against State quota seats for Medical, Engineering and allied courses and for other general courses at Diploma /Graduate and Post Graduate Level.
- Award of Post matric Scholarship to students, who are pursuing various post matric courses and Merit Scholarship & Prerna Scholarship to students of Government Schools and payment of scholarship thereof.

# DIFFERENT TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Vide Notification No: 166/Sch/HRDD, Dated: 13.08.2003 Government of Sikkim has been providing Post Matric Scholarship to the Sikkimese Students pursuing various Post Matric i.e -Professional & Technical courses in the various Universities in and outside the State as stated under::

(a) **Merit Scholarship**, are awarded to students who secure an aggregate marks of 70 % and above in Class XII Board Examination or equivalent examination of any recognized Board for pursuing any under graduate course of his or her preference.



# HCM'S SPECIAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP 2011

The screening Test for HCM's Special Merit Scholarship was conducted at district level on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2010, under the supervision of Joint Directors of District HRD Department. This year 100 students were selected for this scholarship from all over the state,28 (twenty eight) from East District, and 24(twenty four) from the three remaining Districts .Top 16 students were provided admission in the three Public Schools outside the state and remaining 84 students were provided admission in the five Public Schools within the state.

The financial implication for the scheme for the year 2011-12 has been worked out and the fund required after the distribution/disbursement of the  $\mathbf{T}$  42.00 lakhs allotted for the same comes to  $\mathbf{T}$  191.00 Lakhs.

### **CBSE EXAMINATION**

During March – April 2011, the C.B.S.E. class X and XII examinations were held in the State in 29 Examination centers.

The Common Entrance Test (C.E.T.) for MBBS/BE Quota seats was conducted on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> May 2011. This year 637 students appeared for MBBS Course and 612 students appeared for BE Course.

# COMMON ENTRANCE TEST (CET) for MBA & MCA 2011

Common Entrance Test for MBA and MCA was conducted on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2011, this year a total of 82 candidates appeared (58 candidates for MBA and 21candidate for MCA).

# NATIONAL TALENT SEARCH /NMMS EXAMINATION

The National Talent Search Examination along with National Means cum Merit Scholarship examination was held on the month of 2010 and stage 2 National Talent Search Examination was held on 8<sup>th</sup> May 2011. The Meritorious students from class VIII are allowed to sit for the test. This year top 25 students were selected for national level and their names were forwarded to MHRD for 2<sup>nd</sup> level/Stage Examination which was conducted by the NCERT in the month of May 2011.

This year the top 28 student from the entire district of Sikkim were selected for NMMS Scheme.

# CLASS V MERIT /PRERNA SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION:

In February 2011, the merit scholarship examination was held in 9 sub-divisions of the state for awarding merit scholarship at the elementary stage. A total of 54 students are selected every year for the award of general merit and Prerna Scholarship. Six students, three on merit and three from amongst the girls, are nominated from each sub-division for the award of scholarships.

# REGISTRATION OF PRIVATE SCHOOLS AND PRIVATE TUTORIALS/AUTHENTICATION OF CERTIFICATES

The Examination Cell of H.R.D. Department also looks after the registration of all Private Schools/ Private Tutorials of all the districts of State and Authentication of certificates of all Universities within Sikkim.

# VII. RASHTRIYA MADHYAMIK SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA): A scheme for Universalisation of Access to and improvement of Quality at the Secondary and Higher Secondary Stage has started in the State since 2009-10 when the Plan Approval Board in its meeting held on 09.01.2010 approved the proposal for Sikkim Annual Plan 2009-10 and sanctioned the sum of ₹ 10.23 Crores.

Towards the preparatory activities (PPA) under RMSA in the four districts in the State the sum of ₹ 40.00 lakhs was released as grant in aid in the year 2009-10. The sum of ₹ 24.00 lakhs was distributed to the four district RMSA authority and the necessary directions for its utilization in strict adherence with the central guidelines was given. The next installment of the PPA fund shall be considered after submission of the Utilization Certificate for the given advance amount.

Out of the sanctioned annual plan fund of ₹ 10.23 crores, the sum of ₹ 2.30 crores was released during 2010 as the first installment towards incurring the expenditure under both recurring and non-recurring components.

The sum of ₹ 23.14 lakhs as 25% share was advanced to all the 151 secondary and Sr Secondary schools as recurring grant component. The remaining 75% grant amounting to ₹ 70.36 lakhs have to be released as the annual school grant under the recurring component and the required action to this effect is underway.

The remaining sum of ₹ 2.06 crores have been earmarked for the Civil construction component which shall be serviced for constructing library room, laboratory room, classroom etc under the non –recurring grant. It is pertinently pointed out that the construction works have not been able to be executed since there exist a huge disparity in the amount earmarked as the unit cost of construction. The central norm laid for unit cost of construction amounts to ₹ 7000.00 per square metre whereas the State PWD Schedule of Rates ,2006 has fixed the unit construction cost at ₹ 13,000.00 per Square metre. The MHRD,GOI have been apprised about the said difference and also requested for enhancement of the unit cost at par with the State norms. However, the matter still remains unresolved.

Earlier, in accordance with the RMSA guidelines, all the sec & sr secondary schools have been requested to open a separate bank account for RMSA scheme. Altogether all the 151 schools (44 Sr Sec schools and 107 Sec Schools) have opened their respective bank accounts. Likewise the schools have also constituted their respective School Management and Development Committee (SMDC) with further two sub committees, one as Academic Committee and the other as School Building Committee. Besides which the schools have also established their Parents Teachers Association (PTA) which is an important rallying point in the school system. The above Committees and Association have their important role in the overall school management and administrative functioning.

It is an established fact that for preparing a good plan we require authentic and actual facts and figures. The required data can be derived from mainly two sources, viz

- 1. House Hold Survey
- 2. Secondary Education Management and Information System (SEMIS) through Data Capture Format (DCF)

In view of the importance of the required inputs, the RMSA cell have already requested all the district authorities to complete the DCF forms and submit by the end of this month. Together with SSA, the Joint House Hold Survey for 2010 is being conducted and the outcome of the same will be generated according to our individual requirement. For the above exercise, both SSA and RMSA have pooled in ₹ 2.35 lakhs each as advance for meeting the expenses incurred for printing of forms etc.

To this day, the RMSA cell have conducted 14 days training programme for sensitizing the 151 HMs and Principals on the overall status of the scheme highlighting the aims and objectives enshrined therein. Apart from the above, 10 days training programme for the Heads of Primary/JHS and Graduate Teachers on Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) have also been conducted in all the four districts.

Under the civil works component the SPO/RMSA in due consultation with Engineering Cell, HRDD has prepared a construction design for science laboratory, library room, classroom and toilet facility in conformity with the norms laid down in the RMSA guidelines for the engineering works. With the approval of the SPD/RMSA the selected schools on the basis of the Data capture status report were granted civil works fund for construction of library rooms, classrooms etc.

There were altogether 36 selected schools in two category of schools with 25 schools in the first category to be provided with two classrooms, library room, laboratory room and toilet cum drinking facility and the remaining 11 schools with all other construction items

except for the two classrooms. For the first category of schools the civil works grant @ 25% of the total work value amounting to ₹ 5.34 lakhs each were provided in the form of cheque drawn in favour of the school SMDC. For the remaining 11 schools the cheque for ₹ 3.02 lakhs each were provided for the construction works.

On the basis of the work progress, 22 of the schools from the selected lot of 36 schools were provided with the  $2^{nd}$  installment of the grant for equal value. It may be noted that 16 schools have been provided with the  $2^{nd}$  installment of  $\mathbf{T}$  5.34 lakhs @ 25% of the total work value in consonance with the first release. Likewise 06 schools have been provided with  $\mathbf{T}$  3.02 lakhs as  $2^{nd}$  installment @ 25% of the total work value. Another 10 schools have been provided with  $3^{rd}$  installments of the grant for equal value. Out of the above 08 schools have been provided  $\mathbf{T}$  5.34 lakhs @ 25% of the total work value and another 02 schools have been provide with  $3^{rd}$  installment of  $\mathbf{T}$  3.02 lakhs.

With regard to the procurement of Furnitures for Classroom the scheme has sanctioned ₹ 50.00 lakhs under PAB sanctions 2009-10 for 25 schools with two classroom per school @ ₹ 1.00 lakh for furniture of each classroom and the supply order shall be placed with SIMFED for supply work valued at Rs 50.00 lakhs.

As per PAB sanction 2009-10 for purchase of laboratory equipments worth  $\mathbf{\xi}$  61.00 lakhs for corresponding 61 selected S/SS schools the SPO/RMSA had initiated the necessary actions and issued 8 cheques @  $\mathbf{\xi}$  1.00 lakh per cheque to 8 selected schools for procurement of Laboratory equipments for the total amount of  $\mathbf{\xi}$  8.00 lakhs and placed supply order to SIMFED for the supply of laboratory equipments to remaining 53 schools @  $\mathbf{\xi}$  1.00 lakhs per school .

Vide NO F.1-62/2010-SWch.I (B) dated 30<sup>th</sup> March 2011 the sanction intimation for the release of ₹ 1,03,44,000/- as 1<sup>st</sup> installment of Central share as Grants-in-aid for recurring components approved under annual plan 2010-11 to RMSA Sikkim State Mission Authority have been received.

The Annual School Grant @ ₹0.75 lakhs under recurring component for 151 S/SS schools of the State have already been provided for the year 2010-11.

The RMSA plan proposal for the year 2011-12 has also been prepared and submitted to MHRD for consideration. Under the plan proposal various innovative intervention like QCI accreditation of school, NIOS, Guidance and Counseling, Arts and Craft related TLM, Sports material provision etc have been incorporated which will be discussed in the appraisal

meeting followed by the PAB for 2011-12 shortly. As per information received from MHRD the minutes of the meeting shall be delivered to the HRDD, Govt. of Sikkim shortly.

An important intervention under RMSA viz, IEDSS have also been taken care of since last year when the annual plan for IEDSS with an estimated outlay of ₹ 58.15 lakhs was prepared and submitted to MHRD, New Delhi. The said plan projection have not been considered so far due to the reason that the central grant of ₹ 11.07 lakhs released during 2006-07 under IEDC scheme which has been lying unspent so far have to be returned first. The said fund has accordingly been returned to MHRD and the annual plan for 2010-11 was considered recently with the sanction approval for ₹ 3.98 lakhs and out of which the sum of ₹ 1.99 lakhs has been released as first installment. The annual plan proposal for IEDSS for 2011-12 has also been submitted to MHRD and the PM&EG meeting schedule is awaited for the required discussion.

# VIII. DISTRICT INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION & TRAINING(DIET)

ANNUAL REPORT FOR TEACHER EDUCATION INSITUTIONS-DISTRICT INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION & TRAINING(DIET) GANGTOK & DISTRICT RESOURCE CENTRES(DRCs)-NAMCHI & GEYZING, HRDD, GANGTOK FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2010-2011.

There are three Government Teacher Education Institutions in Sikkim, to provide 2-year Diploma in elementary education(D.El.Ed.) Course for Primary Teachers of Government Schools. They are DIET, East, Gangtok, DRCs-South, Namchi & West, Geyzing. These Institutions are 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme(CSS) receiving financial grant from the Ministry of Human Resource Development(MHRD) of the Government of India(GOI).

DIET, Gangtok is an upgraded DIET. The then Teacher Training Institute(TTI) was upgraded into DIET in the year 1989. DRCs-South, Namchi & West, Geyzing were sanctioned in the year 1994 and these Institutions have been functional from the academic session 2010-11.

DIET, Gangtok had started conducting 2-year D.EI.Ed. for pre-service candidates but it has been stopped since July, 2010 in order to clear the back lock of untrained Primary Teachers.

### DIET/DRCs faculty and ministerial staff:

The faculty members of DIET and DRCs are designed as Lecturers and Sr. Lecturers headed by Principal. DRCs are headed by Sr. Lecturers/Vie Principals. They are non-vacation/as they have to organize/conduct short term in-service Training Programme to different cliental of school teachers especially at Primary Level during vacations. Salaries of Principal, Sr. Lecturers, Lecturers and Ministerial staff are met from the CSS grant.

### Curriculum

As regard to Curriculum, DIET & DRCs follow NCTE curriculum with little modification based on the need for the State. The intake capacity is only 50 in each Institute annually.

### **Functions**

- 1. Conducts 2-year D.EI.Ed course.
- 2. Conducts short term need based in-service training especially at Primary level.
- 3. Conducts Orientation programmes for other functionaries working for teacher education eg. BRCs, CRCs, HM, Aganwadi workers etc.
- 4. Monitors and supervises educational institutions in their jurisdiction.
- 5. Extends support for professional development of teacher educators.
- 6. Develops locally relevant Teaching Learning Materials(TLM), evaluation tools etc.
- 7. Develop Training modules, curriculum for in-service teacher training.
- 8. Provides training to Resource persons which in turn give training to the teachers at primary level.





# X. TEXTBOOK SECTION

State Government has introduced some beneficiary schemes for enhancing enrolment at the elementary state so as to fulfill the national commitment of Universalisation of Elementary Education (UEE).

To achieve the goal of Compulsory Elementary Education and to provide quality education in the State, the Government has introduced many beneficiary schemes. In this endeavor, the Textbook Section of H.R.D. Department, Government of Sikkim has been implementing various schemes for the student of Sikkim.

Accordingly, following beneficiaries items are provided free of cost to the students of Government Schools:

#### 1. UNIFORMS:

#### (i) Annually distributed items- Pant, Shirt, Skirts, Tunic & Bakhu Sef.

It is an annual scheme. Free distribution of uniform to the students of all Government Schools from Class I to V and also to the students of notified Government Schools located at remote area upto Class VIII.

#### (ii) Biennially distributed items-Raincoat, School Bag & Pullover.

The above mentioned items are distributed biennially to the students of all Government Schools from Class I to V and also to the students of notified Government Schools located at remote area upto Class VIII.

#### 2. **EXERCISE BOOKS:**

Exercise books are also distributed free of cost to the students from Class I to V of all Government Schools and also up to Class VIII of notified schools located at remote area.

## "Implementation of vocational education at +2 level in 40 Govt. SS Schools in Sikkim:

#### "A brief report"

Since the introduction of vocational education as distinct vocational stream(s)/addl subjects at +2 level in 40 Govt Senior Secondary Schools in Sikkim, the Academic Sessions viz. 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008and 2009 have already been completed under the Vocational Education Programme. The State Government is well aware of the importance of vocational education and has already taken a number of important initiatives in tune with the National Policy of Education, 1986 (POA 1992) and the recommendations of the National Curriculum Framework, 2005 and the National Knowledge Commission as well as the recently released Sikkim State Socio-economic survey, 2006.

The governing norms followed for Vocational Education in the state of Sikkim are as per the approved CBSE scheme of studies and course curriculum which is given below.

The learning area for Vocational Stream as per CBSE norms and scheme of studies includes:

- With the recent declaration of results of +2CBSE Exams, the performance of vocational stream students under the vocational education programme has been commendable.

#### "On the Job Training (OJT)"

- "On the Job Training (OJT)"- an integral component of vocational education curriculum and the CBSE Scheme of Studies was arranged for all the vocational stream students of all the 44 SS Schools & conducted in collaboration with various Private & State Govt establishments viz. Horticulture & CC Dev Dept/Agriculture Dept /Animal Husbandry, LF & VScs Dept/ Transport Dept/ Dept of Information Technology, ICAR, Sikkim Milk Union, Travel Agents Association of Sikkim (TAAS), Hotels viz Royal Plaza, Chumbi Residency, Tibet, Tashi Delek, etc, LIC & others. On the Job Training of Vocational students for one month, as per requirement was conducted at <a href="mailto:variousTraining Centres">variousTraining Centres</a>, located all over Sikkim during December and following years.
- The state, as envisaged under the vocational education scheme has been able to successfully divert 20% & more students from the +2stage students at the 44 Govt SS Schools of Sikkim. It maybe mentioned here that the target coverage of higher secondary students, as envisaged by the Kulandaiswamy Committee Report, 2000 in the Programme was 15%.

#### XV. MID DAY MEAL SECTION

National Programme for Nutritional support to Primary Education Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalisation of Primary Education by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting on nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary level (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was started in the State of Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (Rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry rations to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001- People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked Mid-Day-Meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

Cooked Mid-Day-Meal served to school children of Sikkim up-to Primary level (class I-V) from 2002 and from class (VI-VIII) are being provided from the academic session 2008, Though GOI norms don't cover the children of Pre-Primary classes for hot cooked meal but Sikkim had unique system of such pre-primary classes in all the Schools, these children were given hot cooked meal till the end of academic session of 2009 without any discrimination by the SMC of the respective schools.

Sikkim state has not come across with any major interruption except a few cases of slightly delay in reaching the food grains during monsoon sessions because of blockade of roads, however, with a view mitigate such problems the Heads of Schools are advised to keep buffer stock of food grains during such period.

#### DECENTRALIZATION OF FUNDS TO DISTRICT:

From the academic year 2010 the funds under Mid-Day Meal Scheme has been totally transferred to districts after obtaining enbloc sanction of the Government of Sikkim.

#### AWARNESS PROGRAMME OF MDM SCHEME AT DISTRICT LEVEL:

Awareness Programme of MDM at all the four district had been conducted by the MDM Cell, HRDD attended by Special Secretary, HRDD, Addl. Director [MDM] and officials from the department to sensitize the heads of the schools pertaining to entitlement under MDM, accountability, transparency, participation of stake holders and smooth functioning.

#### HANDBOOK OF MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

Handbook of Mid-Day Meal Scheme introduced by the State Project Office, MDM, Cell, HRDD containing all the Circulars, Guidelines, Formats and details of schools, complexes, BACs, etc has been distributed to all the schools, stake holders.

MDM, Cell, HRDD has aware about the cooking cost and its entitlement of Honorarium to cook cum helpers through local news papers and Doordarshan.

Keeping in view the local context the heads of schools/SMCs have been given freedom to decide the menu of the cooked Mid-Day Meal and in most of the cases items being served are Khichdi, atleast twice a month, rice, dal and green organic vegetables available in village.

Reimbursements of bills are made on the basis of the food-grains supplied to schools as per the allocation as well as receipt of the school's head through the Joint Directors of the respective districts. Districts have their transporter for uninterrupted supply chain of food grains from Food Corporation of India's Godown, Rangpo for North and East district and Jorethang for South and West district.

#### KITCHEN SHEDS:

518 schools against 555 have been covered during 2007-08. The balance amount is lying with the state government. MHRD, Govt. of India released ₹ 333.00 lakh for the construction of kitchen sheds to 555 schools @ ₹ 60,000/- per school during 2007-08 and the state provide ₹ 144.26 lakh @ ₹ 27850/- per school as state share.

The MDM Cell, had obtained sanctioned and approval of ₹ 57.60 lakh to execute the construction work of 96 new kitchen cum store including Sanskrit pathshalas and monastic schools of Sikkim from 2011-12 fiscal year.

## MME(Management, Monitoring & Evaluation):

Govt. of India Sanctioned ₹ 12.03 lakh during 2009-10 and expenditure of ₹ 10.01 lakh incurred.

MDM Attendance Register, Cash Books, Record Books of food-grains were printed and distributed to all schools through district as well as through complexes to maintain the accountability.

Various schools were visited and monitored. Constitution of State Level Steering cum Monitoring Committee of MDM has been constituted.

Circular, Notification pertaining to smooth functioning of MDM was issued to district nodal officers and various agencies and stake holders.

## STATE LEVEL STEERING CUM MONITORING COMMITTEE MEETING:

State Lével Steering cum Monitoring Committee was held on 18<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2010 under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Govt. of Sikkim at Tashilling Secretariat with the officials from different departments.

- 1. In the month of February March developed Basic Primer and Bridge Primer for the Adult Learners.
- 2. Conducted training for 58 Coordinators at S.I.R.D. Complex Karfactar.
- 3. Imparted Training for Preraks and VTs at Block Level in all the BACs of North and West District.
- 4. Launched Saakshar Bharat Programme in West District on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2010 from the hand of Honorable Chief Minister.
- 5. Imparted Orientation and Sensitization Programme to all the Panchayats and Panchayat President at Block and District Level.
- 6. Classes started in functioning in full from the month of July 2010.
- 7. On 20<sup>th</sup> August 2010 Conducted an Evaluation in the guidance of State Resource Center West Bengal (SRC-WB). In which 1600 Learners took part in the Evaluation.
- 8. All the Adult Education Center (AEC) and all the Adult Learning Center (ALC) started functioning at GPU Level in full swing.
- 9. State Resource Center West Bengal (SRC-WB) imparted Orientation/ Sensitization programme to all the officers and Coordinators in regard to revamp the functioning of Saakshar Bharat Mission 2012.
- 10. Conducted First Evaluation of Learners on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2011 where in 4634 registered their names out of which 3975 papered in the evaluation test.
- 11. At Present Sikkim is in the fore front to implement the Mission in the National Level.

  There are 1117 are functioning in two Districts i.e. North and West. There are altogether 6245 Learners studying in various Adult Learning Centers.
- 12. The Total Literacy Mission announced by Honorable Chief Minister of Sikkim on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2010 is also functioning in the ward Level. Survey of Learners is being completed. The department imparted training to the Panchayat Education Assistant in the month of October and November 2010. The teaching and learning material for the learners has been provided by the panchayats in most of the wards. Few are yet to function.

## XVIII. DIRECTORATE OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION

#### A. Direction and Administration

The Directorate of Technical Education has been functioning in the H.R.D. Department ever since 1998 and there has been considerable activity in this area. The importance of modern technology and the advent of the computer age have resulted in the urgent need to equip our students with adequate knowledge and exposure in these areas. The industrial growth in the State will to a large extent depend on the existence of a base of skilled technicians. The State Govt has taken the initiative to meet these challenges and this is reflected in high priority it

has accorded to and its policy statements on Industry and Information Technology and Education.

The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) is primarily charged with the responsibility for overseeing the functioning of the two Polytechnics namely ATTC and CCCT established under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project.

The DTE also is administratively charged with dealing with matters relating to the establishment of Private Universities and Sikkim Manipal University, and its constituent colleges, namely Sikkim Manipal Institute of Technology (SMIT) at Majhitar and the Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences (SMIMS) at Tadong. There are four private universities functioning in the State at present.

The administrative control of the Scholarship Section is also added to the Directorate of Technical Education, hence there is slight enhancement of proposed expenditure in the office expenses.

## B. Grants-in-Aid out of the State Plan to the two Polytechnics ATTC & CCCT

Under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project, two polytechnics namely Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC) and Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT) have been established. The Project period was from January 2001 till June 2007. During the Project period all expenditure relating to Civil Works, Equipments, Furniture, Books and LRs, Vehicles, Consultancy charges as well as recurring expenditure on account of Salary, Consumables and O&M are fully borne under the Project.

After the termination of the project period on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2007, the polytechnics are functioning as autonomous bodies and they have also been recognized as Societies under the State Government. In order to maintain the huge infrastructure generated under the Project, grants in aid will have to be given by State Government to support the polytechnics till they are self sustainable.

## C. Establishment of Polytechnic

The Government of India through Ministry of Human Resource Development is in the process of launching a Mission on Vocational Education and Skill Development. The main objective of the mission is to enhance economic growth and employment and create a pool of trained manpower. The technical training programme through the Polytechnic is being given a boost under the said Skill Development programme.

Government of India is in the process of providing one-time financial assistance of ₹
.00 crores for establishment of one Polytechnic in each of the two districts where there are no Polytechnics. We have already established a Polytechnic in the South and East districts of Sikkim.

The proposal for establishment of two more Polytechnics in North and West district of Sikkim is processed. The State Government would have to provide land free of cost and this has been identified at Mangshilla in North and Kyongsa in West Sikkim. A provision of at least 10 acres of land for each polytechnic at a cost of around Rs.1.00 crores per polytechnic and for two new polytechnics ₹ 2.00 crores for cost of land has to be made.

#### D. Establishment of NIT.

One NIT is established and functioning with three streams at Ravangla on a land provided by the State as a temporary campus. Unavailability of 300 acres of land in the area has necessitated to identify a new land for NIT and the process of identification of land for establishment of NIT at Khamdong is initiated in a 300 acre of land to be made available with the purchase of land from the public.
